What is the Finnmark Estate?

- 2006: Finnmark Act, Finnmark Estate and FeFo
- Finnmark Act: recognition of Sami rights in Finnmark
- The largest non-governmental landowner in Norway (14% of mainland Norway), 48 000 km²
- FeFo manage the Finnmark Estate on behalf of the inhabitants, led by a board appointed by the Sami Parliament and Finnmark county council
- FeFo is self-financed, i.e. all operating costs must be covered by the revenues
- FeFo work with management of fish and game, industry and real estate

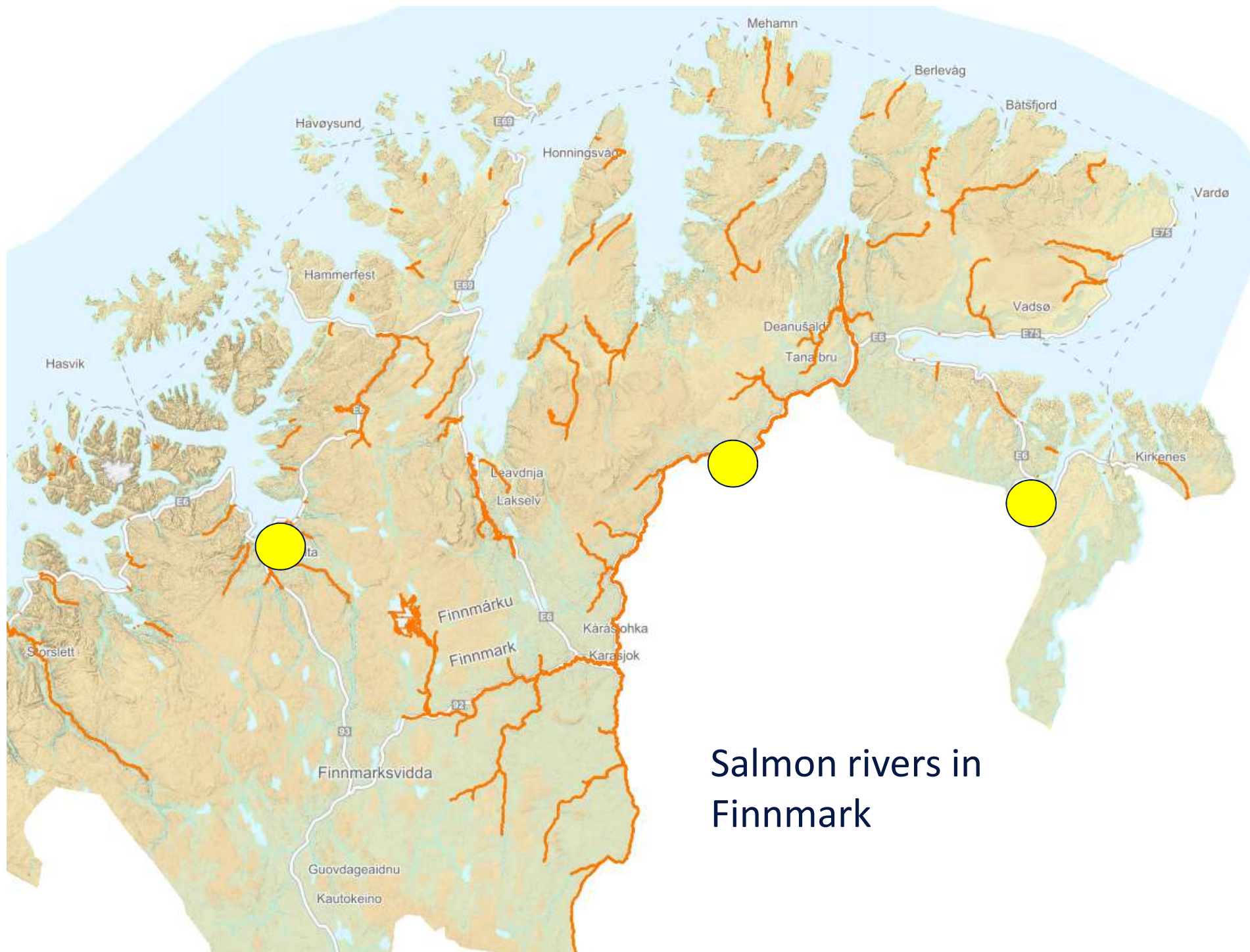




The department of fish and game management:

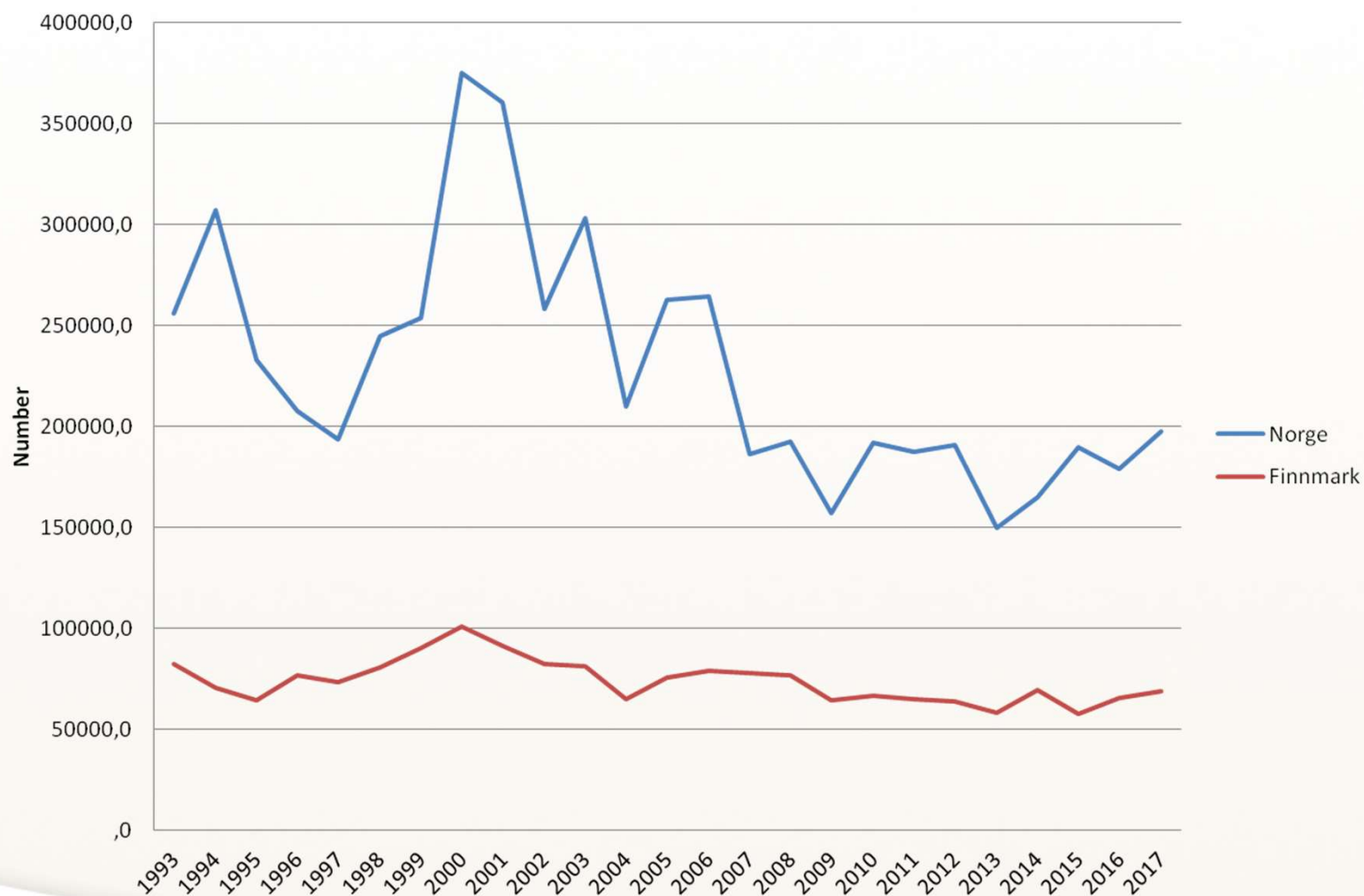
- More than 50 salmon rivers
- About 60 000 lakes with inland fishing
- More than 5 500 inland fishermen
- More than 1 600 net fishing locations in the sea
- More than 1 000 moose licenses
- About 2 000 moose hunters
- More than 5 000 small game hunters
- More than 350 net fishing licenses in the sea



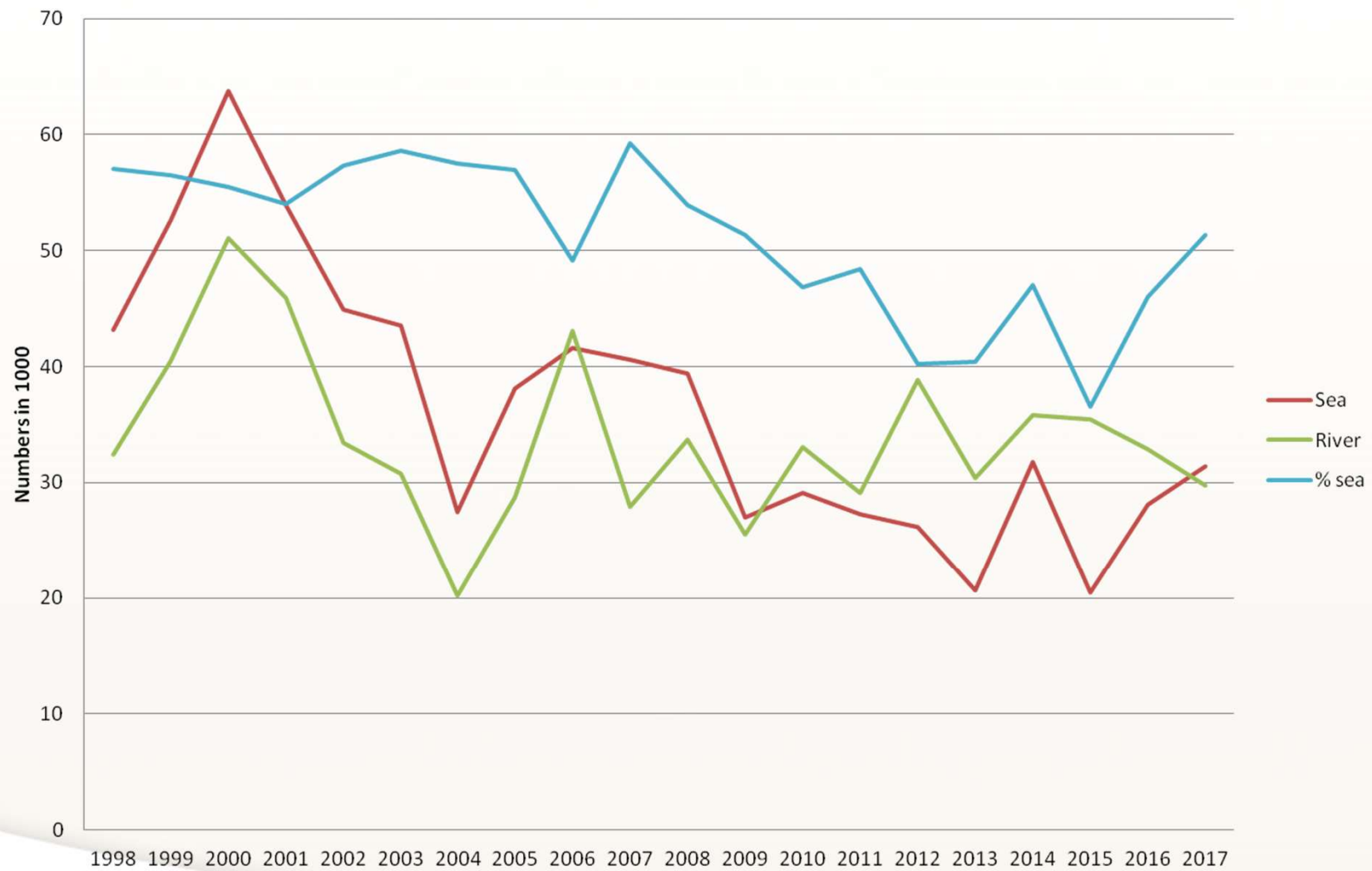

Finnmark

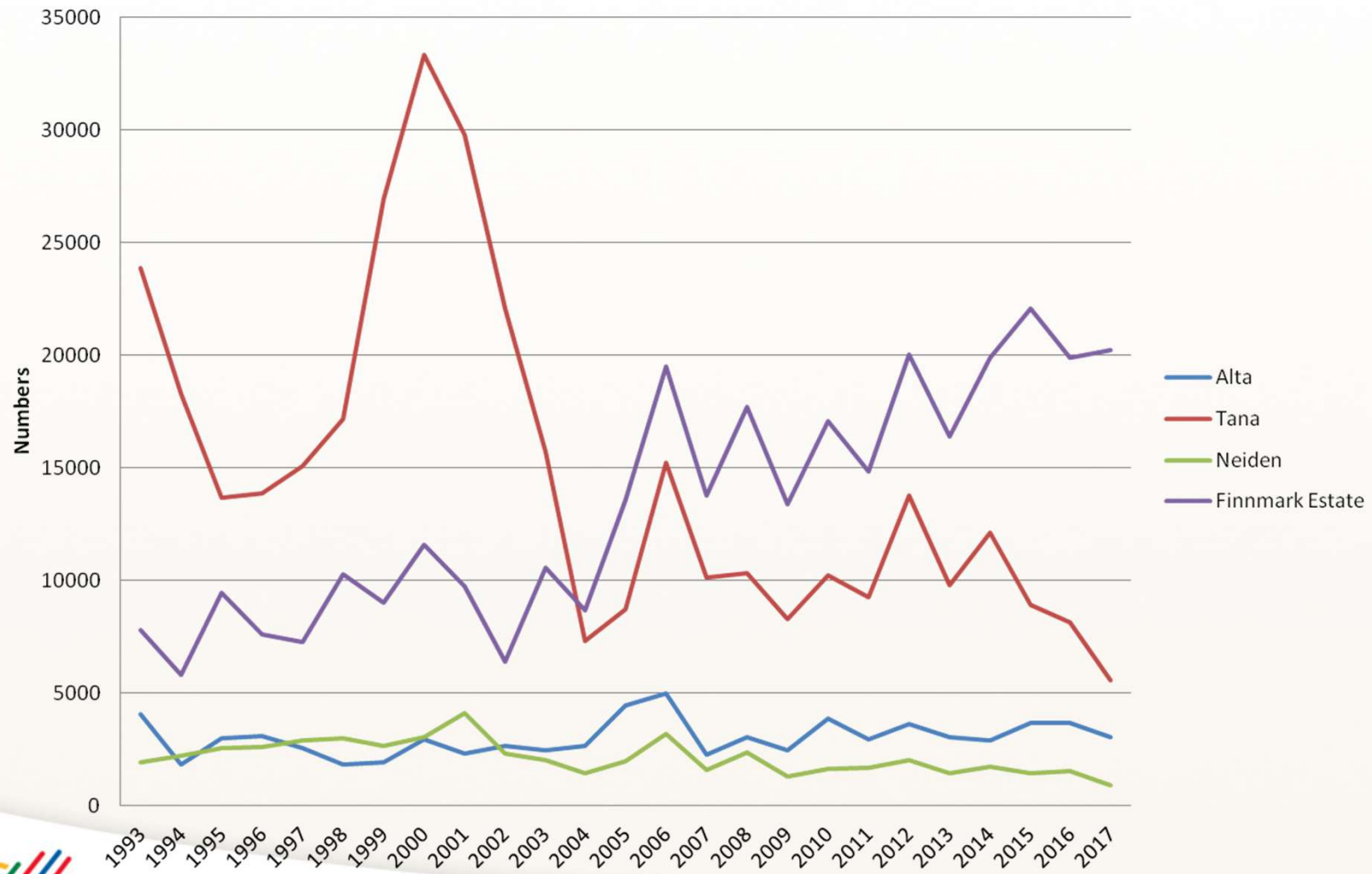
Total catch of salmon



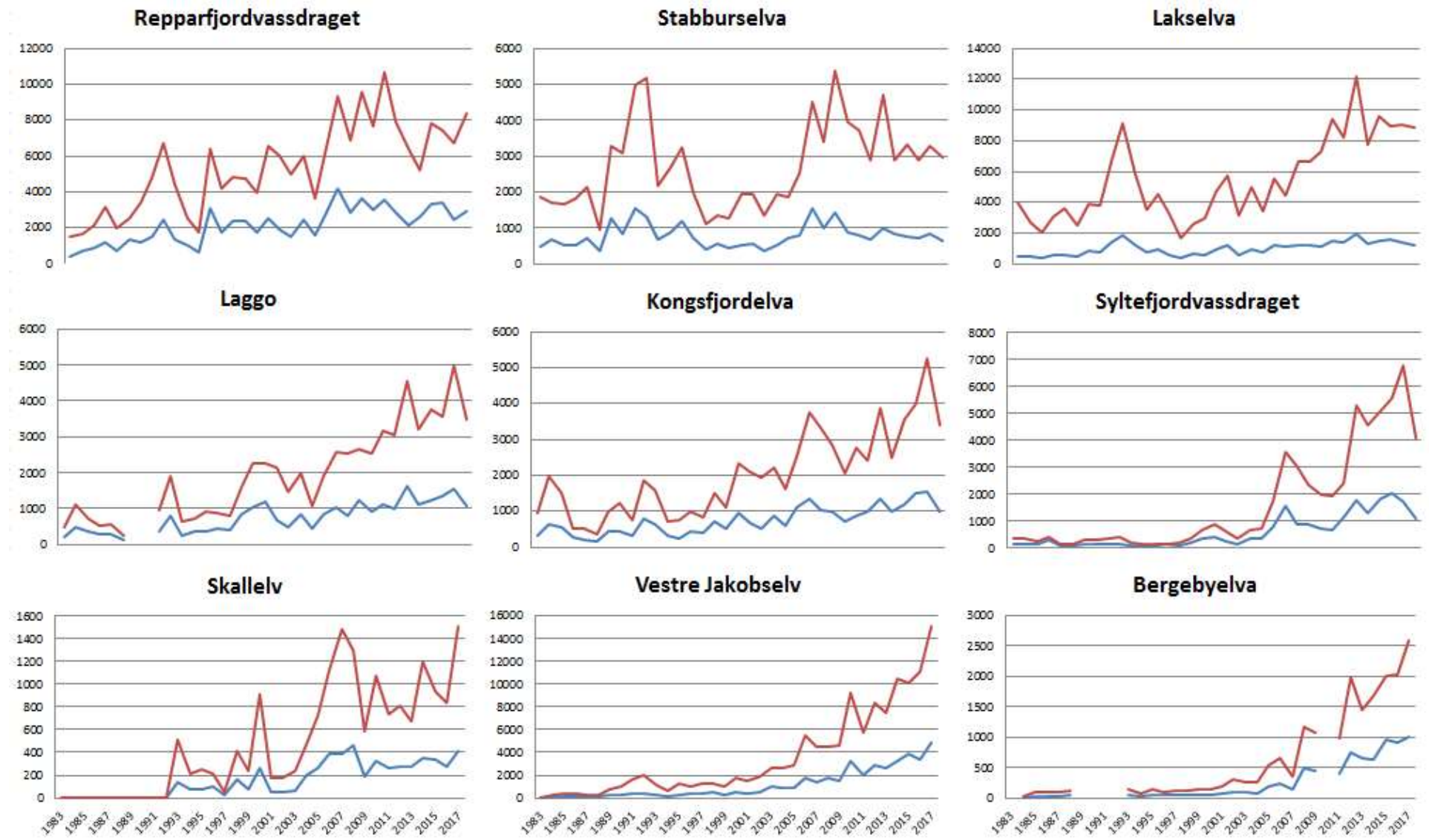
The catch of salmon in Finnmark



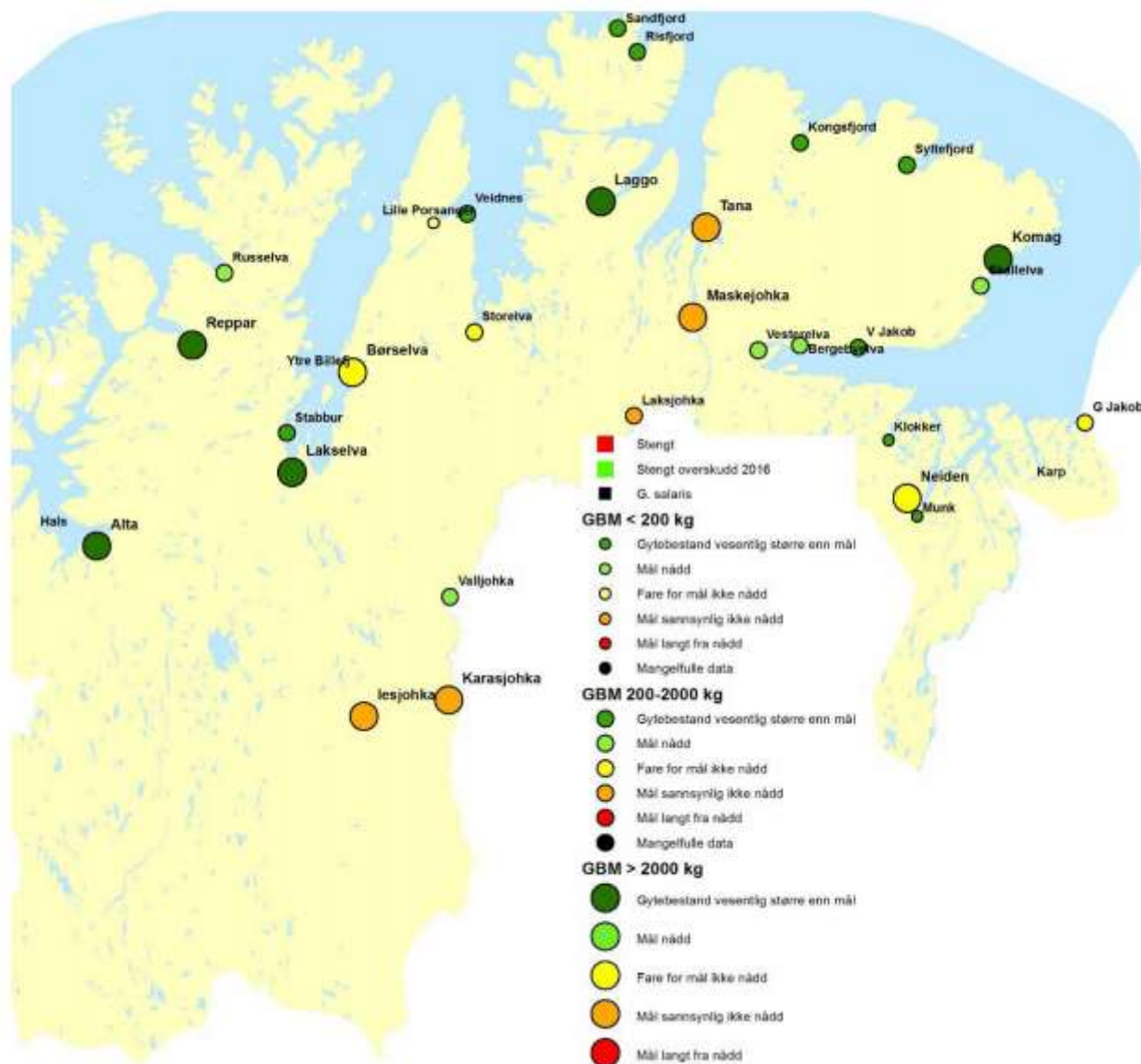
Salmon catch in some rivers in Finnmark



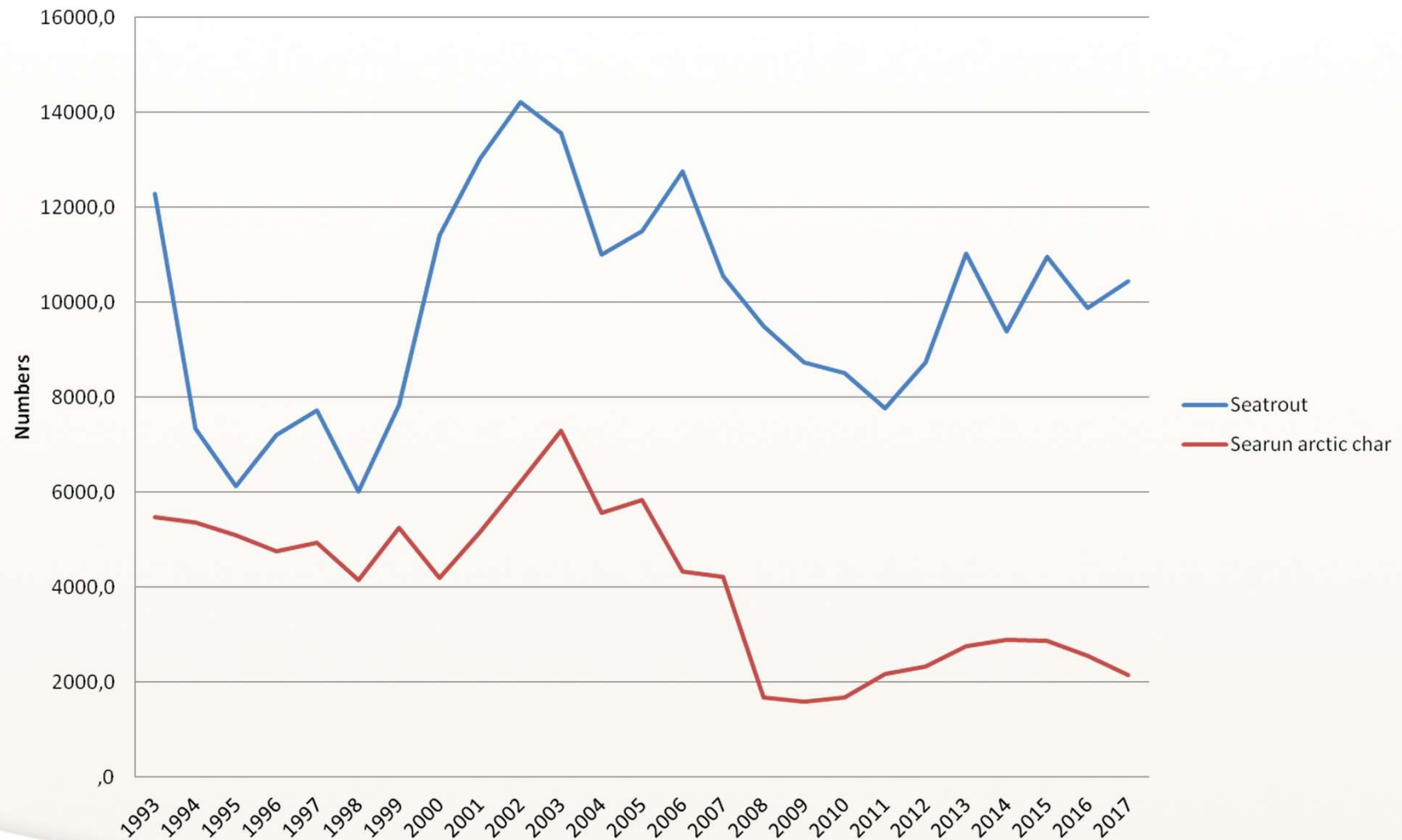
Development in catch in FeFo rivers
